LChD statement on the invasion of Ukraine

In light of unprecedented military aggression against Ukraine by the Russian Federation and the Republic of Belarus and the gross violation of international law, the Lithuanian Chemical Society (LChD) terminates any cooperation with the Russian Federation and the Republic of Belarus and their officials. Scientists representing the institutions of the Russian Federation and the Republic of Belarus as well as independent researchers from these countries (not representing any institution) and co-authors of abstracts are not welcome at events and conferences organized by LChD. These restrictions do not apply to citizens of the Russian Federation and the Republic of Belarus, who represent scientific institutions of other countries.

LChD expresses full solidarity and support for people of Ukraine in their fight for freedom, independence and integrity of Ukraine, the European vision and progress of democracy. We strongly condemn the shameful attacks of the aggressor Russian Federation against Ukrainian scientists, the educational community, and every Ukrainian.

LChD brings together members from universities, research institutes and private companies in Lithuania and will seek to establish a close cooperation with Ukrainian scientists and scientific institutions by organizing joint conferences, seminars or workshops.
